To be successful in this role you will need to have a passion for restoring native ecosystems as well as the following:

Essential:

- A degree in Environmental Science or related discipline or substantial experience in lieu of higher graduate qualification
- Experience in preparing weed / vegetation management plans, including costings
- Experience in managing the implementation of weed / vegetation management plans, including budget management
- Ability to prepare proposals and manage projects, including development of detailed budgets and schedules
- Practical knowledge in a range of restoration techniques (e.g. bush regeneration, revegetation, erosion control, feral animal control etc)

- Experience in bush regeneration, especially as a team leader / supervisor
- Great written and verbal communication skills
- Current driver's licence.
